The Sisters takes care of the Rosary Evangelization as requested by Saint Charles Caritas, and have a mission in Cebu island. The convent name is Divine Mercy. The sisters are taking care of the poor abandoned mentally challenge. **Picture 3**, below were the Sisters from St. Bridget located in Tijuana, Sisters Brenda and Catalina both are US Citizens and they can cross the border. I was able to buy them food at Costco. The semi contemplative convent has 27 sisters. Before, they sells cookies for their food to support themselves, but churches are closed for several months now **Picture 4**, two boxes full of pasta were shipped to the Hospitaller Sacred Heart of Jesus and under Sisters of the Immaculate of St. Clare, Paliparan 5, Teacher Norly will manage the cooking and distribution of soup for the project "Feed the Children". I will give you the details later about this new project. These projects are in the Philippines.

Majority of the missionary Sisters in TJ and Ensenada cannot cross the border because the border is still locked down in both sides unless you are US Citizen.
