A project like this has been on back of my mind for awhile, and I would say, it is a huge passion project of mine. I love 3D printing and I want to use my craft to help children in my home country.



As of this year, six storms hit the Philippine islands. super storm "Egay" did a lot of damaged to the northern part of the Philippines. Now, another storm "Falcon" is coming. Please pray for the Philippines people safety.

"Good morning Po tita, I'm so worried because early in the morning it was raining but children started to come around 8:00 am and the rain stopped around 8:30 am. First, the children go to the chapel and pray after they greet the sisters. They help the sisters, and then they play. Sr. Joana with the Mothers cooked the "merienda" (snacks).



The bell rang at 9:30 am for the animation and reading of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. Sr. Mary Dann gives the reflection " let us to do good things so that we will be belong to the righteous and we can enter the kingdom of God." She asked specific examples to the children of the good things that we need to do. One of the children's said we need to follow the ten commandments.

Our "merienda" (snacks) for today hot oatmeal, pancake with peanut butter and juice (food items shipped by Saint Charles Caritas).



At 10:30 am, John Mark, one of our scholars, shares with children about the ten commandments, and at 11:00 am is the 3rd day of our triduum for the proclamation of the venerability our Mother Foundress Mother Miradio.

\*September 23 & 24, Saturday & Sunday (4th Sunday) will be the Saint Charles Caritas.

Special Projects: School Supplies for Children in Mexico and the Philippines, Students Transportation Allowances, and Jim's Project Homeless Help #74. In Tijuana/Ensenada children, we need in-kind, and for the Pray the Rosary and Canossian Catechism children school items will be purchased in the Philippines. For both charities, these are backpacks, notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers and pencil sharpeners.

- (1.) \*\*\* In the Philippines: Teach the Children How to Pray the Rosary in the Paliparan squatter area and Canossians Sons of Charity in the island of Negros Occidental, children attending Catechism, 65 children in Canossian Sons of Charity

  Oratorio/Catechism, and 67 children for Teach the Children How to Pray the Rosary. The school supply cost per child is \$6.03. a total of \$448.67 x 2 = \$795.96.
- (2.) \*\*\*In Mexico, Tijuana and Ensenada: 45 little children in Casa de Cuna ages 3 to 6 years old attending pre-school, and 50 Santa Teresita children from elementary to high school.

The estimated costs for two charities in the Philippines are 49,354 pesos = **\$897.35**. The school supplies are: backpacks, notebooks, pencil & sharpener, pens, and erasers for 132 children from kinder to high school.

- (3.) \*\*\* 26 Students transportation allowance for residence of Pontevedra, Negros Occidental island. These allowances are managed by the Franciscan Sisters of St. Anthony. 20 high school 150 pesos =  $$2.73 \times 20 = $4.60$  for 1 student per week, and 6 college students, 250 pesos =  $4.55 \times 6 = 27.30$ , for 1 student per week. Total =  $81.90 \times 4$  weeks = 327.60 average a month. If you pitch in for this project, it will be sent on the last week of August.
- (4.) \*\*\* Jim's Homeless Help Project #74 bagging of food will be on August 26, Saturday at noon in room 13. For kids who wanted to have school community service hours, please bring your forms and sign in when you arrive for your volunteer time. On September 2, Saturday starts at 7 am at the garage will be the distribution of food and toiletries to our homeless friends around the South Bay. We are going to caravan in cars to seek for them.
